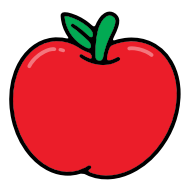
# Counting Numbers

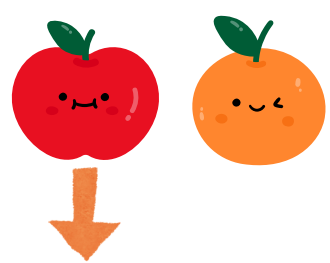
# Ordinal Numbers

**Definition:** An ordinal number is a number that tells the position or rank of something in an ordered list or sequence.

Number: 1st



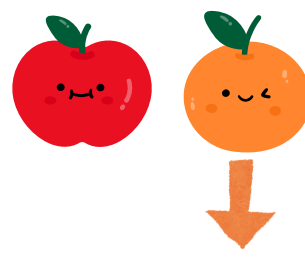
Example:

Number: 2nd



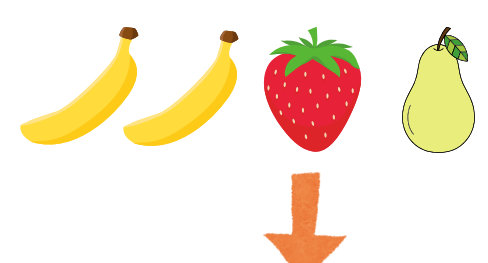
Example:

Number: 3rd



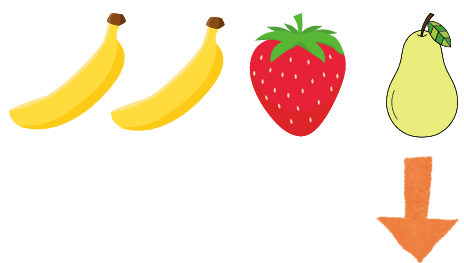
Example:

Number: 4th



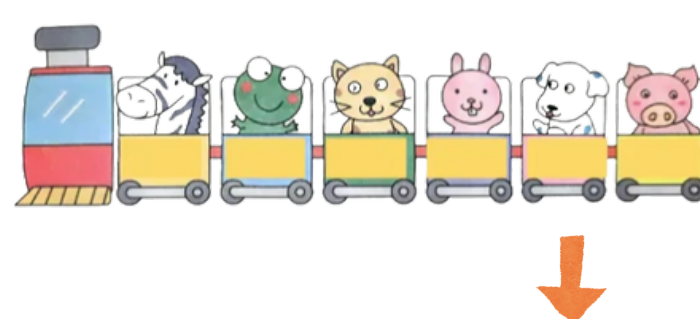
Example:

Number: 8th



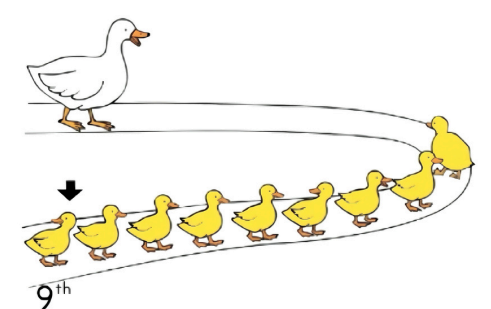

The last duck is the **ninth** one.

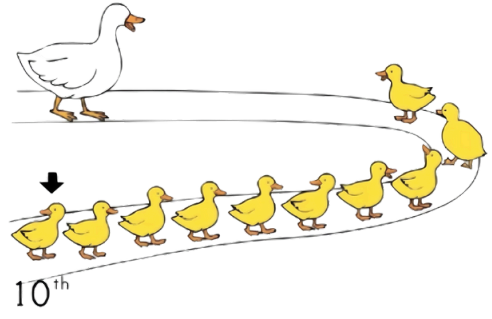

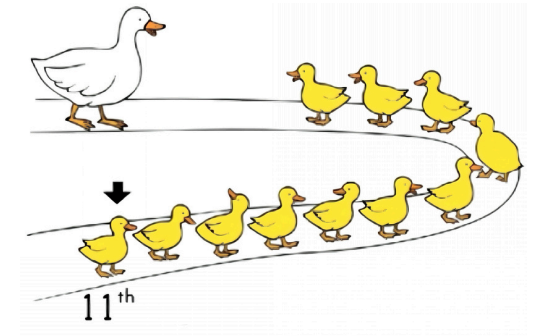

Number: 11th



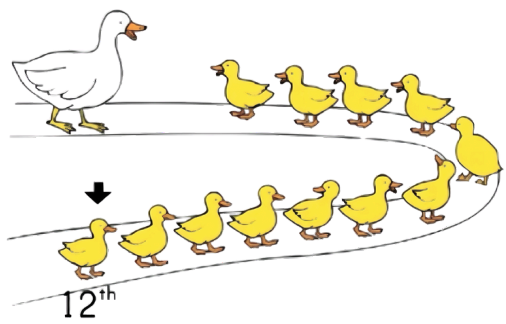

Number: 12th



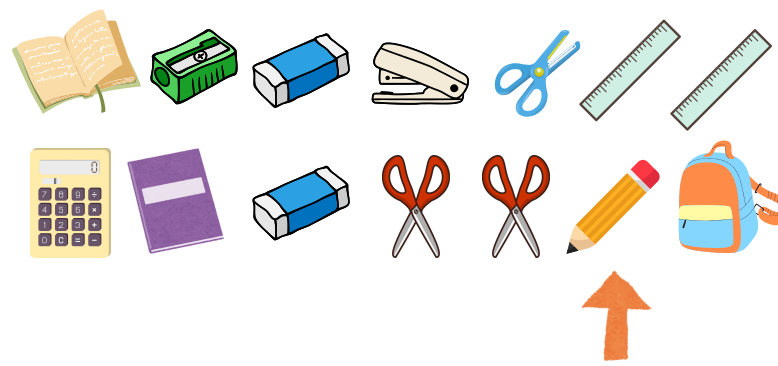

Number: 13th



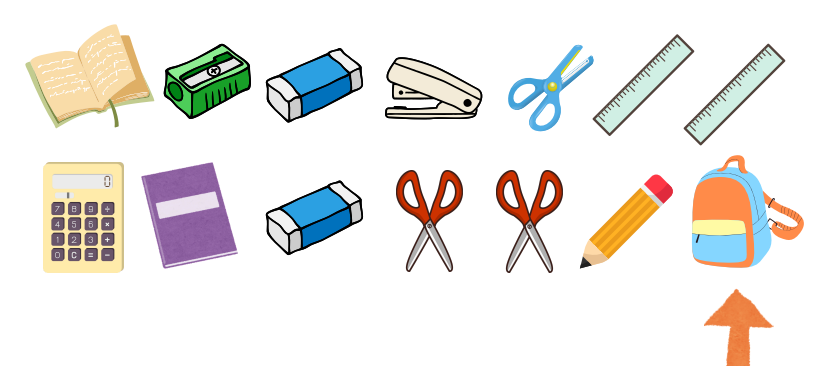

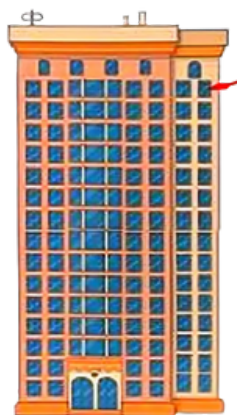

Number: 18th



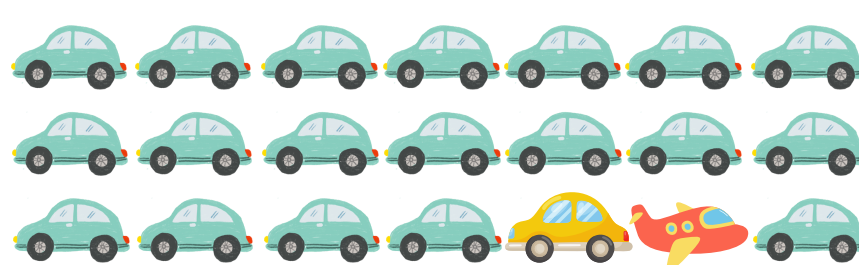

Number: 19th



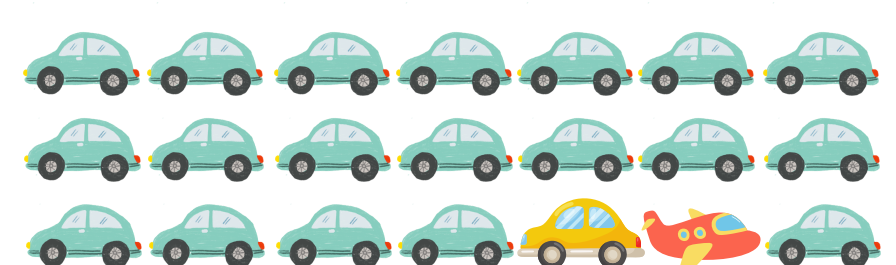
