For Boarding School Applicants (optional section)

- Has your child ever been away from home before?

Tips: Always Expect Follow-Up Questions

Admissions staff often ask follow-up questions to better understand your values, test consistency, and hear real examples. Be ready to go deeper.

- Use real examples to support your answers and show thoughtful reflection.
- Be specific, not perfect. Authenticity matters more than polish.
- Pause if needed. Taking a moment shows thoughtfulness.
- Know your child. Speak honestly about their strengths, growth, and personality.



Questions You Can Ask the School

- What are the school's academic requirements?

- Who supports students socially and emotionally?
- What is your approach to discipline?
- How much homework is given each night?
- What is your philosophy on balancing academic and social growth?
- How do you help students develop communication skills?

Extracurriculars & Enrichment:

- What unique programs or enrichment opportunities are available?
- · How do you encourage intellectual curiosity and creativity?
- What sports, clubs, and leadership opportunities exist?
- How do you support students interested in arts, athletics, or STEM competitions?

Parent-School Communication:

- How do you keep parents informed throughout the year?

Early Childhood & Kindergarten (Ages 4-6)

These interviews focus on readiness, basic knowledge, and social behavior.

- What's your address or phone number?

Behavior & Readiness

- Can you follow directions (e.g., stack blocks, sort colors)?
- What shapes, letters, or numbers do you know?
- What do you like to do at school?
- What's your favorite color, animal, or toy?
- Can you draw a picture or describe what you drew?

Social Development

- Who is your best friend?
- What games do you like to play?
- What do you do when you're upset or frustrated?
- Do you like working by yourself or with friends?

Parent-Child Interaction

- What do you like to do with your mommy or daddy?
- What do your parents do for work?
- What did you do last weekend?

Academic Questions

- Can you count to 10 (or 20)?
- What number comes after 6? Before 4?
- 2 plus 3 is?
- Can you name these shapes (circle, square, triangle, rectangle)?
- Can you spell "BIG"
- Can you write a word with three letters?
- Can you write your name?



Elementary School (Grades 1-5)

Interviews here assess early academic curiosity, basic self-reflection, and school readiness.

General & Personal

- Tell me about yourself.
- What do you like to do for fun?
- What's your favorite book or movie?
- What makes you happy? What makes you frustrated?

Academic

- What subject do you like the most and why?
- What's a subject you find hard?
- Tell me about a game or project you enjoyed.
- How do you stay organized with homework?

Social & Emotional

- Who is your best friend? Why?
- Have you ever had a conflict with a friend? What did you do?
- · What do you do when something is hard at school?

Aspirations & School Fit

- Why do you want to come to this school?
- What are you excited to learn here?
- What do you hope your new teacher will be like?
- Do you have any questions for me?



Middle School (Grades 6-8)

Focus shifts to self-awareness, learning habits, and growing independence.

Personality & Reflection

- How would your friends describe you?
- What are you most proud of?
- What's something unique about you?
- What do you want to get better at?

Academic

- What's your favorite subject and why?
- What's a recent school challenge you've faced?
- How do you approach homework or time management?
- Describe your ideal school day.

Social & Leadership

- Tell me about a group project you worked on.
- Have you had to solve a conflict with a friend or teammate?
- What do you like to do after school?

Future Fit

- What do you hope to accomplish at this school?
- What kind of community are you looking for?
- Why did you choose to apply here?



High School (Grades 9–12)

High school interviews focus on academic motivation, critical thinking, goals, and contribution to community.

Personal & Character

- Tell me about yourself.
- What are your strengths and weaknesses?
- What do you do for fun outside of school?
- Who inspires you and why?

Academic & Extracurricular

- What is your favorite class and why?
- What class do you find the hardest, and how do you manage?
- What are your academic goals for high school?
- What extracurricular activities are most important to you?

Problem Solving & Critical Thinking

- Tell me about a time you faced a challenge. What did you learn?
- What would you do if you saw someone being treated unfairly?
- How do you handle group projects or team disagreements?
- What would you change about your current school?

Aspirations & Fit

- Why do you want to attend this school?
- What can you contribute to our school community?
- What do you hope to gain from this experience?
- Do you have any questions about our programs or community?
